

Meet & Greet by our chauffer at Hotel Lobby & driven to the Kuala Gandah Elephant Conservation Sanctuary. Transport provided in an air-conditioned vehicle along with your English speaking driver. On this tour you will get the opportunity to see orphanaged Elephent learn about the conservation of the elephant and also watch a 30 minute National Geographic documentary. Experience the limestone cave of the Batu Caves on the way to elephant sanctuary.

Batu Caves

Stop- 60 Minutes (Q



Batu Caves is a limestone hill that has a series of caves and cave temples in Gombak. Selangor. The limestone forming Batu Caves is said to be around 400 million years old. Some of the cave entrances were used as shelters by the indigenous Temuan people (a tribe of Orang Asli).

The cave is one of the most popular **Hindu shrines** outside India, and is dedicated to Lord Murugan. It is the focal point of the Hindu festival of Thaipusam in Malaysia.

Batu Caves in short also referred as 10th Caves or Hill for Lord Muruga as there are six important holy shrines in India and four more in Malaysia. The three others in Malaysia are Kallumalai Temple in Ipoh, Tanneermalai Temple in Penang and Sannasimalai Temple in Malacca.

Note:

Keeping your eyes open to be aware of the monkeys. Don't feed them!

Hold cameras close and use a neck strap if you have one.

Pahang is the largest state in Peninsular Malaysia. It's known for its mountains range of Titiwangsa. Pahang is also largest producer of timber in this country. You also have the opportunity to see the rubber plantation on the way.



The Kuala Gandah Elephant Conservation Centre is situated in Lanchang. This is the main attraction of this small town apart from agriculture and the many FELDA projects of both rubber and palm oil plantations. You also will be driving pass the aborigines bamboo huts & their re-located houses.

Kuala Gandah Elephant Sanctuary

Stop- 2.5 Hrs ()

Back in 1989, the Malaysian Wildlife Sanctuary established an elephant sanctuary within the Krau Wildlife reserve for rare Asian Elephants.

These elephants were displaced due to the continued poaching and logging for urban and agricultural development within the area. This conservation method was initiated to preserve the species, care for the young before they're released to the wild.

Documentary Video Show:

Watch a 30 minute National Geographic documentary about conservation & re-location of the elephants. Malaysian Wildlife also promote their advocacy and conservation efforts to gather support.

Join in the activities and be awed by these magnificent creatures as feed & observe the elephant roam safely about the grounds of the sanctuary. Spend a moment to learn how trained professionals care and nurture these elephants on a daily basis without causing the elephants stress. All in all, this will be a truly enriching experience that will leave you with a pleasant feeling as you are ferried back to your hotel.

After finish exploring and having fun with elephant there, the tour will be conclude by driving back to Kuala Lumpur.

Additional Activities:

Hand-feed the Elephants

Enjoy the experience of feeding the elephants at this large sanctuary. You can feed themdirectly through the mouth or by letting the elephants playfully curl their trunks aroundthe sugarcane. There is a stall selling these treats by the bundle for only RM3. This isdefinitely going to be a fun activity to do with your family!

Additional Activities:

Bathing with Elephants

You will get a chance to bathe the elephants under the careful supervision of thecaregivers. There is a schedule for bathing activities, which are available from Monday to Thursday only. It is advisable for you to bring extra clothes and a towel if you're planningto jump into the river to give the baby and adult elephants a long, good scrub!

Visit the Elephant Museum

At the Kuala Gandah National Elephant Conservation Centre, you can find a smallmuseum which allows you to learn more about this endangered animal and their historyin the country. There are also replicas of elephant bones and skulls being displayed in themuseum.

Watch the Video Show

If it's too hot outside, you can make yourself comfortable in the air-conditioned roomwhile watching a documentary on elephants. The video sheds light on their dwindlinghabitats and the involvement of the Trans-location Team in safeguarding the survival ofthis threatened species. The showing duration is around 25 minutes.

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Additional Information's:

- It is important to note that elephant rides are not available here. Visitors are advised to understand the purpose of this sanctuary, which is to educate and not to entertain. Therefore, rides are prohibited as a way to protect the elephants.
- There are a few things that you should keep in mind before planning a trip to Kuala Gandah. Firstly, make sure to wear a cap and bring along a bottle of water with you as the mid-afternoon sun can get hot and unforgiving.
- Bring along extra clothes and a towel if you plan to participate in the elephant bathing activity.
- We also suggest that you bring your own snacks and water. There is a small stall selling refreshments but the choices are limited so do pack some in advance!
- Bathing activity would be cancelled if water level is dangerous
- Please be informed that in line with the sanctuary's enhanced approach in conservation practices, the elephant riding activity has been discontinued in the centre. The new regulation is enforced to avoid causing distress to the elephants and enabling them to live in their natural environment as much as possible
- Bathing activities, which are available from Monday to Thursday only
- You will be required to sign this indemnity letter before entering the conservation center

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
